LANDCOVER ATLAS OF PAKISTAN - LAUNCHED

Pakistan Forest Institute (PFI), under Forestry Sector Research and Development Project prepared and launched Landcover Atlas of Pakistan which is based on scientific research using the latest techniques of Geographic Information System (GIS) and Remote Sensing. The chief guest of the function was Mr. Wajid Ali Khan, Honorable Minister for Environment, Govt. of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa.

Speaking on the occasion, Minister for Environment, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Mr. Wajid Ali Khan said the study provides a scientific monitoring mechanism of natural resources particularly forests and underscored the need for its continuation with regular intervals for preparation of management plans.

Referring to the report, he stated that total forest area of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa that was earlier only 17 percent has now increased to 20.3 percent showing a significant increase of 3.3 percent due to government's effective strategies and regular plantations.

He said the Landcover Atlas report has dispelled all the impressions regarding deforestation and reduction of forests areas in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa as contrary to facts. The climate change and global warming have posed great threats to environment and this positive effort of PFI will help to give boost to the global and regional efforts to tackle these issues on scientific basis.

The Minister said that forest and glaciers of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa were great source to generate water for agriculture sector of the country and their protection was not only the responsibility of the government but of the civil society as a whole.

The Minister said that this study will provide a guideline for researchers and students in future and directed the officials to inform masses about its significance. Close coordination between different national building institutions and educational institutions are must to take full advantages of each other's expertise and commended the efforts of PFI team for conducting such a comprehensive study. Earlier, the Director GIS made a presentation and explained key features and contents of the atlas. The Secretary Environment and Director General Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Syed Said Badshah Bukhari appraised the participants about different phases and aspects of the study. He said, PFI had established GIS and Remote Sensing Centre in 2004 under Forestry Sector Research and Development Project to assess the existing forests types and other landcover of the country through using latest GIS/RS techniques.

He said, Landcover Atlas report has been shared with all provincial forest departments, including Azad Kashmir and FATA and valuable suggestions from the concerned departments were incorporated in the study. Forestry experts from across the country and province participated and termed the study a comprehensive and based on facts.

PFI PREPARED RANGELAND POLICY FOR KHYBER PAKHTUNKHWA

Pakistan Forest Institute (PFI) prepared the first-ever Rangeland Policy for Khyber Pakhtunkhwa in consultation with other stakeholders and with support from International Centre for Integrated Mountain Development (ICIMOD). The draft policy was unveiled during a one-day workshop held on 31st December, 2012 at PFI, Peshawar. The workshop was attended by a large number of participants from Environment, Forest, Wildlife, Agriculture and Livestock Departments, Universities, FAO, IC, ICIMOD and local NGOs. Minister for Environment, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Mr. Wajid Ali Khan was the Chief Guest on the occasion. Secretary Environment, Government of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Syed Said Badshah, Bukhari, was also present on the occasion.

The Secretary Environment told the participants that Rangelands of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa are important natural resources which provide a wide range of goods and services, having significant social, economic and ecological values. However, these resources are facing a number of challenges, threatening their integrity, productivity and sustainability. To protect, conserve and properly manage these resources, a well defined policy for the rangelands is a basic requirement. A number of attempts has been made in that direction at national level but that could not be successfully concluded. After 18^{th} Constitutional Amendment, the subject of rangeland management has been exclusively shifted to the domain of provincial governments which gives imperative to formulate and adopt

rangeland policy at provincial level. The current initiative was started by PFI with support from ICIMOD and prepared a comprehensive rangeland policy within a short time.

Mr. Anwar Ali, Forest Mensuration Officer, PFI, presented the draft of the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Rangeland Policy. He said that the goals of the proposed policy are to protect, conserve and develop the rangelands of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa in a sustainable manner through participatory approach; enhance the production of the desirable mix of goods and services of rangelands to the level of potential productivity; contribute to biodiversity conservation, control and reversal of desertification and land degradation and climate change mitigation and adaptation; and support livelihood and well-being of dependent communities and other stakeholders. The policy calls for sustainable management of rangelands in accordance with scientific principles of range management aimed at ensuring multiple benefits from the rangelands. It is proposed that a separate institutional setup will be created in the Forest Department for rangeland management.

Addressing the workshop, the Minister, for Environment Mr. Wajid Ali Khan appreciated the efforts of PFI for formulating a rangeland policy for Khyber Pakhtunkhwa. He said the enforcement of the policy would help conserve and develop natural resources of the rangelands of the province. This endeavour of PFI will enable the government to significantly contribute to the national efforts to comply with obligations under international environmental conventions and protocols including UNCBD, UN Conventions on control of desertification, UNFCCC and other such efforts.

ADMISSIONS TO M.Sc./ B.Sc. FORESTRY COURSES (SESSION 2012-14)

The process for admission to M.Sc. and B.Sc. Forestry courses session 2012-14 against self-supporting general seats started in the month of August, 2012. Admission notice was advertised in a number of leading English and Urdu newspapers including The News, Dawn, Jang, Aaj and Mashriq. The last date for submission of applications was 12.9.2012.

Services of National Testing Service (NTS) were hired for conducting the entry test which was held simultaneously on 23.09.2012 at six centres established throughout the country i.e. Peshawar, Islamabad, Lahore, Multan, Karachi and Quetta

WORKING PLAN CAMP

Working plan camp of M.Sc. and B. Sc. Forestry Session (2010-12) was conducted at PFI Field Station Shinkiari w.e.f. 12-07-2012 to 01-08.2012 under the supervision of Mr. Ghayyas Ahmad APoF, Mr. Yousaf Khan LIF, Mr. Anwer Ali FMO and Mr. Sohaib Ahmed LIF. Mr. Asadullah, Lecturer Agricultural University Peshawar was especially invited to deliver lectures on Forest Management Plan during the first week of the camp. Students were given lectures on Working Plan preparation, organization, practices of forest inventory in coniferous forests, forest inventory techniques, data collection, data analysis and compilation. On the completion of lectures, students collected and analyzed data from practice plots. Then with the help of local staff compartments were allocated to students at field station Shinkiari for full enumeration and partial enumeration methods. Students were also taken to Moist Temperate Forests Hillkot for collection of data by full enumeration and partial enumeration methods. Imparting field knowledge to forestry students beside theoretical knowledge is a bright aspect of studies at Pakistan Forest Institute. For this purpose, field tours are arranged to various ecological zones of Pakistan. The very first tour that forestry students conduct after joining PFI is called Orientation Tour. In this tour, students are oriented to different types of natural forests as well as irrigated plantations. Orientation tour of M.Sc. Forestry session 2012-14 was conducted from 24-12-2012 to 30-12-2012 under the supervision of Mr. Yousuf Khan (Lecturer in Forestry) and Mr. Sohaib Ahmed (Lecturer in Forestry). During whole tour, Director Forest Education Mr. Hakim Shah accompanied the class. During this tour, Students were shown Scrub Forests of the Margalla Hills, Chir Pine Forests and Moist Temperate Forests of the Murree Hills and Galiat. Students also visited Islamabad Zoo to learn about captive breeding on wild animals. Students were taken to Changa Manga Irrigated Plantation where they were given briefings about Sale Depot, Irrigation lay-out, Nursery techniques and forest recreation. On the last day of the tour, students visited Jallo Forest Park near Lahore where they studied flora and fauna of the park.
